ELISHA & THE CHARIOTS OF FIRE

Opening thought

In our final story from the Old Testament power prophets, Elisha aids the Israelites by warning about the movements of the enemy army. The king of Aram suspects a traitor, but learns that it is actually the work of Elisha. When they attempt to capture Elisha things don't go as planned! An unseen force is standing guard and the tables quickly turn as Elisha strikes the enemy with blindness and leads them into Samaria as prisoners of war.

This is a story about unseen things. From it we learn about God's presence and protection.

For personal reflection or group discussion.

- Which of the 5 senses would be most difficult for you to lose?
- Do you believe in guardian angels? (check out Heb 1:14, Mt 18:10)

Questions to go deeper in your faith.

What do you find most amazing about this story? The way Elisha knew the movements of the enemy? The horses and chariots of fire? God opening the eyes of Elisha's servant? God blinding the Arameans? The way the enemy was treated in Samaria?

There is a spiritual war happening which we cannot always see. Read Ephesians 6:10-18. Which piece of the armor of God do you most need right now? Why?

Share about a time when God intervened to protect you.

Elisha tells his servant in verse 16, "Don't be afraid." Why does the presence of God calm our fears?

Thank you, Lord for watching over us. Open our eyes to see your hand at work. Free us from fear and give us courage to stand strong in the face of the enemy. Protect us from evil and fix our eyes on our Lord Jesus. In His name we pray, Amen.
