Naaman had a problem with leprosy... and pride

1. Don't be a llama Don't let pride keep you from God's blessings.

Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.

1 Peter 5:6

2. Be a kangaroo Keep moving forward in the Lord's strength.

So he went down and dipped himself in the Jordan seven times, as the man of God had told him, and his flesh was restored and became clean.

ELISHA & NAAMAN'S LEPROSY

Opening thought

Naaman was a commander in the Aramean army. But as great a man as Naaman was, he had a problem. He had leprosy. The cure involved washing seven times in the Jordan River, but Naaman didn't want to do it because of his pride. The Lord wanted to cure Naaman of more than leprosy. From his story we learn that although each of us is broken, God can heal us.

For personal reflection or group discussion.

- What is your best "home remedy" for a cold or illness?
- What is your most embarrassing moment?

Questions to go deeper in your faith.

Elisha told Naaman to wash seven times in the Jordan River. Why do you think that was the cure? What might God have been teaching Naaman?

Llamas will remain in a makeshift pen with a single rope rather than lowering their heads to escape. How was Naaman like a llama? How can people be like llamas? (2 Kings 5:11-12)

What evidence is there in this story that Naaman had changed spiritually as well as physically?

Read 2 Kings 5:15-16. Why do you think Elisha refused to accept gifts from Naaman?
