Key verse

As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.

John 20:21

Jesus doesn't call us to be spiritual consumers, but spiritual contributors

1. Contributors are selfless

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves. Philippians 2:3

2. Contributors stand out

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Acts 1:8

3. Contributors are steady

Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Galatians 6:9
