Opening Thought

Over the next nine weeks we will explore the book of Philippians. This letter focuses on discovering contagious joy in the Lord. It was written while Paul was imprisoned, and helps us to flourish as part of God's kingdom regardless of our circumstances.

As Paul begins his letter, he shares his hope for the church, that we increase our joy through the support of friends, service to others, and spiritual growth.

Dig deeper

- Do you think people are less happy today than they were 25 years ago? Why?
- John mentioned three ways to increase your joy. Which are you doing the best in right now? Which one needs the most improvement?
- How does Paul's statement in Philippians 1:6 bring joy to you?
- What seems to consistently threaten your joy?
- Despite challenging circumstances and his prison chains,
 Paul rejoices. When we encounter the troubles of everyday life, how can we choose joy?
- What has helped you grow spiritually in the past?
