DISCUSSION GUIDE MARCH 10

Opening Thought

In Acts 15 some people were teaching that in order to be saved, Gentiles needed to be circumcised. The truth of the gospel is that we are saved by grace – as a free gift. We trust Jesus, he accepts us, and therefore we walk in obedience to him. Simply put: Jesus + nothing = everything.

• What do you tend to overcomplicate?

Dig Deeper

- While the issue of circumcision is not pressing for us today, in what areas do you see a religious mindset that says, "If I obey, then I am accepted by God?"
- Read Acts 15:22-31. What is the tone of the letter? What are its main points? What strikes you from it?
- What things have you wrongly been told you must do in order to be saved?
- In 15:2 there was "no small dissention and debate" over this "Jesus +" teaching. See Galatians 5:1-12. According to Paul, why was this such a big deal?
- James proclaims that we are saved by grace, but still requests that the Gentile believers refrain from deeply offensive pagan practices. How is this different from the false teaching that one must be circumcised in order to be saved?
- What stood out to you from today's sermon?
