Key verse

The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful.

Opening Thought

We all love a good story. This summer we are studying twelve of the best stories - the parables of Jesus. Come sit at his feet and find out what he teaches about his kingdom, salvation, and wise living. His first parable is about a farmer who sowed seeds. Our hearts are like soil into which the gospel is planted. Are you ready to hear the Word? Are you ready to dwell in it and allow it to dwell in you? Are you willing to share the word and plant gospel seeds yourself?

Ice breaker

- Do you have a green thumb? What are you most successful at growing? Least successful?
- Do you consider yourself a good listener?

Dig Deeper

- As you consider the four soils mentioned in this parable, which of them best describes your response when you first heard the gospel?
- What have you found to be the most helpful in helping you grow spiritually?
- What "thorns" and "rocky places" tend to choke out your spiritual growth?
- John shared six passages that describe spiritual fruit in the Bible. Point out one you see in another group member.
- Read 1 Peter 1:22-23. What part challenges you the most?
- Jesus says that the seed on the path represents people who hear the good news but don't understand it. (Matthew 13:19) What can we do to help others better hear and understand the good news?
- What stood out to you from today's sermon?
