Opening Thought

1 Peter encourages suffering believers that through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have the confident assurance of a new life. We are to live boldly for Jesus, even through trials. Because our hope is a living hope, we can know the certainty of salvation and grow in maturity as we press on in faith. Because of Jesus, we have a living hope!

Ice breakers

- Share about a time that you felt out of place.
- What is one thing that is on your bucket list? (something you hope to accomplish before you die)

Dig Deeper

- Peter's given name was Simon, but Jesus changed it to Peter (John 1:35-42). Why is this significant?
- Is there anything in your life that has changed since you have been following Jesus?
- Choose one verse from this passage (1 Peter 1:1-12) that stands out to you. Explain.
- Think of one or two things that you'd like to work on in the coming week in response to this passage. Share with your group.
- How does hope in Christ keep us from fearing this world?
 Are there any ways we've been allowing ourselves to be overwhelmed by the culture of fear?
- How does Peter's introduction (verse 1-3) help you appreciate or understand the three persons of God?
- In verse 8 Peter talks about believing although we have not seen. Think of a time that you have experienced the presence of Christ. Share.
- Compare 1 Peter 1:7 to James 1:2-4 and give two reasons why God permits Christians to face troubles.
- What are some areas of your life that could use some hope?

Closing

Put your hope in God! We are living for something beyond this life. Jesus gives us hope and that changes everything.
