## **Key Verse**

# 1. The Gospel Connects Us to God

God did this so they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. Acts 17:27

#### 2. The Gospel Moves Us to Repentance

## **Opening Thought**

The early church proclaimed that God made all things through Jesus. He did this so we would seek him and find him. Paul declared that God is not far from any one of us. The unknown God has become known through Jesus.

#### **Ice Breakers**

- Do you like history? Why or why not?
- Are there parts of this historical account in Athens that stand out to you?

#### **Dig Deeper**

- When you read scripture do you ever fall into the trap of just pushing to get to the end of the passage?
- When we look at Paul's messages and letters he starts by pointing us toward grace, rather than what we are supposed to do. What do you think that means?
- Do you think it is possible to keep God's commandments to the level that he requires?
- Read Matthew 5:48. What do you think Jesus means when he says "be perfect"?
- Where are you placing your identity? Do you find it easy or difficult to keep your identity in Christ?
- Read Colossians 3:1-4 and discuss it as a group. What does it mean to be "hidden" in Christ?
- What stood out to you from today's sermon?
