- Do you think the people that begged Jesus to touch the edge of his robe (tallit) understood that Jesus is the messiah that he would fulfill this prophecy? (Do a quick Google search on the word TALLIT to understand what it is.)
- Why do you think Jesus sent His disciples out on the water, knowing there would be a storm?
- Why are trials a good thing? Are you going through any trials that your core group can be praying for?
- Read Mark 6:51-52 Why do you think they didn't understand it until Jesus got into the boat?
