Opening Thought

- What do we know about the Corinthians? Is there anything similar to our culture?
- Read 1 Corinthians 1:18. Why is the message of the cross foolishness to the world?
- John shared 3 keys to keeping unity at MCA. Which one do you most want to work on in your own life?
- What would happen if a church decided to completely quit gossiping? Are you willing to commit to it?
- How might Satan benefit from disunity among followers of Jesus? How can we thwart his plans to sow discord?
